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Pairing dishes with rosé wines is becoming increasingly popular among the top restaurants of the world. The following pinks, selected from Provence and the Rhone Valley, have enough weight and depth to marry beautifully with salads, grilled fish and even Middle Eastern cuisine!

Sancerre « Signature » Rosé, Pascal Jolivet **2016 18.00€**

Sancerre is better known for its white wines made from Sauvignon Blanc. Producers here also make cracking red and rosé wines such as this delicate and subtle rosé made from 100% Pinot Noir. It displays classic aromas of red fruits and berries.

Bandol Rosé, Domaine de Terrebrune **2015 24.00€**

When it comes to Bandol rosé, it's hard to go past Domaine de Terrebrune. In recent vintages, this delightful wine has been characterised by classic Provence aromas; pink grapefruit, lemon zest, apricot, with an intriguing and exotic spicy character.

« Les Clans », Château d'Esclans **2015 39.00€**

Les Clans is the first of the higher end cuvees from this producer, and marks a major departure in the way Rosé typically tastes. Restrained, smoky nose but loads of super smooth fruit on the palate with a very classical and refined structure. It drinks like a high end Burgundian white wine with a buttery and mineral finish.

If you are looking to make more of a statement with your rosé selection then look no further:

« Garrus », Chateau d'Esclans **2015 79.00€**

Heralded as the greatest Rose in the world, Garrus' limited quantity (6 barrels per vintage) makes it a highly select wine. Noted for its creaminess and lush mineral finish, this wine is uncommonly elegant and has achieved cult status among the wealthy elite of the French Riviera. 70% Grenache, 30% Rolle, the grapes are selected from fabulous 80 year old vines. This is a powerful, balanced wine with faint oak influences and good length. Superb with food!

If Provençal rosé doesn't set your taste buds tingling then we are also able to offer a number of pinks from around the world. Here is a mere snapshot of the wines, styles and regions we cover so again, please don't hesitate to ask for additional options.

« Kadette » Pinotage Rosé, Kanonkop Stellenbosch, South Africa **2014 15.00€**

A full bodied style of dry rosé now. This wine showcases perfectly the character of the Pinotage grape, but in a much more delicate and subtle form. Vibrant cherry, raspberry and strawberry complimented by a touch of vanilla. This is a great wine to pair with sushi, grilled seafood and even something a little spicy!

Garnacha Rosado, Vinedos Artazu Navarra, Spain **2014 16.00€**

A beautifully light and approachable Grenache from the North of Spain. Juicy and luscious red fruits dominate this lively and fresh rosé

« Il Rosé di Casanova », La Spinetta Tuscany, Italy **2013 19.00€**

Salmon pink with an orange tinge in the glass, the nose leads with delicate flowers, red berries and citrus. The palate is awash with pomegranate, cherry and a hint of dried sage. Bewitching stuff!

Delicate and citrusy, with notes of white flower and grapefruit and a pleasantly green and herbaceous finish. A great little aperitif and perfect with seafood, sushi &, of course, oysters!

Chablis « Domaine », William Fevre **2015 19.00€**

Burgundy, France

Very fresh bouquet with notes of citrus and white fleshed-fruit. Fresh and supple, the wine is marked by mineral notes that are typical of the appellation.

Pinot Grigio, Santa Margherita **2015 13.00€**

Friuli, Italy

Clean with subtle aromas and a bone-dry taste. The delicate touch of Golden Delicious apples make Santa Margherita's Pinot Grigio a wine of great personality and versatility - and a Yachting favourite!

Pinot Grigio, Jermann **2015 24.00€**

Friuli, Italy

A far cry from the watery and tasteless Pinot Grigio's which so often give this grape a bad name. A touch of almonds and vanilla, a hint of fruit and spice on the palate.

Because of their moderate alcohol and vibrant, slate-infused acidity, Mosel Rieslings are some of the most elegant and subtle wines in the world. This is clean and bright with a pronounced fruity aroma.

Mosel, Germany

Lime, freshly-squeezed grapefruit juice, wet stone and delicate floral notes leap from the glass. This is a typically zesty and aromatic Riesling which displays great complexity and balance.

Apple, pear, grapefruit and almond notes with a refreshing and intriguing finish.

Piemonte, Italy

Aromatic and rich yet surprisingly delicate! A sumptuous wine with plenty of fruit and a delightful, supple texture, perfectly balanced with refreshing acidity.

70% Sauvignon Blanc, 16% Vermentino, 8% Verdicchio, 6% Viognier. A cracking wine showcasing the very best of Sauvignon Blanc but with more depth and a more rounded body.

Well balanced and full flavoured, this wine is packed with notes of acacia, honeysuckle, plum, pear and light smoky notes.

Toasty and smoky with a touch of hazelnuts and plenty of white flowers. This is a deliciously complex wine with layer upon layer of flavours.

A blend of Grenache and Syrah this is a sunny wine from a sunny climate. On the nose, red and black cherry come through along with riper rounder notes of plum and a hint of dark chocolate and clove.

Fleurie, Joseph Drouhin **2015** **17.50€**
Beaujolais, France

Brilliant bright purple with lovely fruit to the nose along with a touch of spice, this is full of vigorous deep red fruit along with a dash of pepper.

Mercurey, Joseph Drouhin **2013** **23.50€**
Burgundy, France

A delicate and floral wine with cheeky hints of soft spice. Earthy tones and a little grip on the palate give this wine intrigue beyond its unassuming price tag.

Clos Vougeot, Méo-Camuzet **2013 292.00€**

This elegant, medium-bodied wine has supple tannins and a delightfully earthy character, despite its relative youth. A very accomplished wine with a beautifully creamy finish.

Volnay 1er Cru, Coche Dury **2014 340.00€**

Very fruit forward, particularly redcurrant and strawberry flavours. Quite firm and muscular but already drinking beautifully. Quite rustic and with a touch of pepper on the finish.

Charmes Chambertin, Dugat PY **2013 495.00€**

A surprisingly powerful effort from this vintage, with very ripe and defined flavours. The finish is long and weighty and the fruit flavours go on and on.

Grands Echezeaux, Domaine d'Eugénie **2013 559.00€**

Red fruit and also a touch of blackberry with an alluring hint of forest-moss and sea-spray. A feminine, elegant and very approachable wine.

La Grande Rue, Lamarche **2012 590.00€**
